NOTRE DAME COLLEGE Course Offerings Booklet - Summer 2011

Summer semester starts May 16, 2011 and ends August 7, 2011. The summer semester includes Undergraduate Summer, Summer I, Summer II, the Online Summer Session, and Graduate Summer Sessions I & II and Graduate Online. Please note: Each session has different starting, ending and withdrawal dates; watch the calendar carefully.

Admission

New Students: If Summer 2011 will be your first term of credit at Notre Dame College and you wish to pursue a degree or a certificate, you need to apply for admission PRIOR to registration. If you graduated from high school in 2006 or later, please contact the Office of Admissions for application materials. Those who graduated before 2006 or who wish to enroll in our graduate program are to contact the Finn Center for Adult, Graduate, and Professional Programs.

<u>Non-degree seeking Students</u>: If you wish to attend Notre Dame College during Summer 2011 but do not wish to pursue a degree or a certificate, you will be exempt from our formal admissions process. Please contact the Registrar's Office for a Statement of Admissions Exemption.

Transient Students: If you will be attending Notre Dame College as a transient student, you will need to submit an official statement (see form) signed by the Registrar or Academic Affairs Officer from your home institution verifying both good academic standing and successful completion of appropriate prerequisite(s). (See Transient Student Registration Packet.) Transient students wishing to use financial aid for summer school will need to contact the financial aid office at their home school. You will need a Notre Dame email account, which is applied for with your registration form. Once registered, your Notre Dame email address will be emailed to the email address you provide on your registration form.

Registration

You may register for Summer 2011 in one of three ways:

- Submit your registration in person at the Registrar's Office
- Fax your registration (including permission letter, if applicable) to Registrar's Office at 216-916-4999
- Mail your registration to the Registrar's Office (with advisor's signature, if applicable) to:

Summer registration begins February 1. Forms are available online, in Student Services or in the Advising Office. The last day to register for an undergraduate online class is May 23; for Graduate online the last day to register is May 27. Registration for all other sessions will be taken up to the first class meeting.

Once your registration has been processed, you will receive confirmation and billing information by mail.

Grade Reports and Transcripts

Grade reports for all summer courses will be mailed out by August 19, 2011.

To request an official academic transcript, please access our payment servicer – CashNet, where you will find the request form. CashNet and the form can be found at www.notredamecollege.edu. Official transcript requests are processed within five to seven business days following the request. Transcripts needed in less than 5-7 days can be requested – stipulations are detailed on the request form. You may also request a transcript in person at the Registrar's Office. Grade reports are processed in batches; this occurs only one time during the summer term. There are no exceptions to this.

Audit/Non-Credit Options

Some undergraduate courses are open on a space-available, audit/non-credit basis. You may register for a 1, 2, or 3 credit course on an audit/ non-credit basis for a fee of \$65 per credit hour. Financial Aid may not be used to pay for audited/non-credit courses.

Tuition and Fees

Tuition is as follows:

Session I & II, Full Summer, Online Undergraduate Classes \$260/credit TEEL Students (ALL courses; ALL sessions) \$420/credit Grad I & II, Online Graduate Classes \$475/credit Audit/Non-Credit \$65/credit

No additional discounts are available for summer classes.

Tuition is due in full no later than the first day of instruction for each session. Notre Dame College accepts cash, and check payments in the office. Credit card payments are accepted through the CashNet system. CashNet only accepts MasterCard, American Express, and Discover. There is a 2.75% fee for using credit cards. Electronic check payments are accepted free of charge through CashNet.

Financial Aid

Current students who are planning to attend summer school at Notre Dame and want to apply for financial aid will need to do the following:

- 1. Complete the 2011-2012 Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). This application is online at www.fafsa.ed.gov and the results must be submitted to us. NDC School code 003085.
- 2. If selected by the federal government, complete Verification. We will notify you in writing if you need to do this.
- 3. Complete the Summer Financial Aid Application available at http://www.notredamecollege.edu/sites/default/fileuploads/summer-application-and-Enrollment-Plan-Form-11-12_0.pdf after February 1 and **return it to the Financial Aid Office once you have filed and received the results of your 2011-2012 FAFSA Application.**
- 4. All new borrowers must complete a Direct Stafford Loan Master Prom Note (MPN) and Entrance Counseling at www.studentloans.gov

Federal financial aid funds are earned by maintaining attendance across the entire summer term. If you cease to attend or earn <u>all</u> F's, W's, and/or I's, you may lose all or part of these funds based on federal regulations.

Online Programs for Notre Dame College

IT IS THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO ENSURE THAT ADEQUATE COMPUTER ACCESS IS AVAILABLE THROUGHOUT AN ONLINE COURSE.

Online courses at Notre Dame College are delivered in an accelerated format, with most courses running for eight weeks, rather than the traditional, on-campus format of fifteen weeks. The same objectives and academic content that are covered in a classroom course over 15 weeks are covered in the online course in only eight weeks. In order to successfully complete a three credit online course, a student should expect to spend a minimum of 8-10 hours per week participating in learning activities related to the course. Learning activities will be a combination of online and offline assignments.


Are you ready for an online course? A great deal of research has looked at the qualities that successful online students possessed. Following is a list of the most common qualities the studies found. Although an online student doesn't need to possess all of the qualities listed, the successful online student will possess most of them.

- Initiative as a self-starter; does not procrastinate.
- Discipline to complete projects by deadlines instead of waiting until the end of the semester.
- Motivation to read, write, and participate fully in class activities.
- Ability to work independently and in teams.
- Flexibility in dealing with technology problems.
- Excellent reading and writing skills in the English language.
- Ability to learn from the printed word the majority of materials and communication are available through reading and writing.
- Discipline to set aside specific times on a routine basis to 'participate' in the course.
- Willingness to ask questions for clarification.
- Good basic computer and email skills.
- Good time management skills.

<u>Technical requirements</u> – Most students already have everything they need to participate in an online course. The following items will give a student the best chance for success in an online course:

- A computer (laptop, desktop, or netbook) purchased within the last 2 years
- Microsoft Office 97-2003 or 2007 (One copy of Microsoft Office 2007 Software Package is available to each Notre Dame student (one time) for a fee of \$40.00. Contact the IT Department, 216-373-5244.
- A broadband internet connection (dial-up connections will not support the online tools)
- Current version of a media player such as QuickTime (available free at http://www.apple.com/quicktime/download/ or Windows Media
 Player (available free at http://windows.microsoft.com/en-US/windows/products/windows-media-player)
- Current version of Adobe Reader (available free at http://get.adobe.com/reader/)
- Virus protection software is strongly recommended
- Some courses have what is called a "live classroom" using Wimba. If
 the course you are enrolled in uses the Wimba live classroom, you will
 need a computer headset. (available for as little as \$19.99 at outlets
 such as Radio Shack, Best Buy, Walmart, and Microcenter). This
 component is necessary to alleviate feedback through internal
 speakers when you are talking in the classroom.
- When reading the Academic Schedule, if the Wimba Live Classroom is a required component of your course, the day/time will be indicated on the schedule. Your course syllabus can provide more detail as to the expectation of participation in the live classroom meetings.

If you feel that you have the desire and ability to be successful in an online course, start by contacting your advisor. After getting the approval of your advisor, students are required to complete "Is Online Learning for Me?"; this is an orientation module. To enroll in and complete the module, you will go to http://moodle.ndc.edu. Log in using your NDC email username (prefix of the email address, everything before @) and your current password. In the Search box enter Is Online Learning for Me? and Click



Search results will appear as a course to select for enrollment. Click on the title to self enroll. Should you need additional support you can contact the

Department of Online Educational Services to access this orientation module, onlineedservices@ndc.edu.

After completing all reading, viewing the video tutorials, and completing the readiness assessment, you will meet with the Director of Online Educational Services or Associate Director to obtain final approval. Both the advisor's and Director or Associate Director's signatures are required on the registration form to register for an online course.

Refunds will be made after written notice of withdrawal is filed with the Registrar's Office. The amount of the refund will be calculated from the date appearing on the withdrawal form.
