Responsibilities

The Notre Dame Division of Professional Education invites applications for a full-time faculty position in special education at the level of Assistant Professor, beginning August 2018. The successful candidate will assume a range of responsibilities including teaching undergraduate and graduate courses in a F2F or online environment, participating in broad-based college and departmental committee work, professional service, supervising students in field experiences in various school settings, and serving on committees for students completing the Master of Education degree.

Specific areas of special and/or research interest may include, but are not limited to, assessment, MMIS licensure, best practices for accreditation compliance, content-area learning, behavior disorders, team collaboration, and effective instruction of culturally and linguistically diverse learners with disabilities. Applicants with expertise in exceptional children and the curriculum, pedagogy, collaboration, collection and electronic storage of accreditation data, and legal issues surrounding the education of students with mild to moderate learning needs are encouraged to apply.

Minimum Qualifications

Ph.D. or Ed.D. in curriculum and instruction or special education

Current K-12 MMIS teaching license and school experience teaching individuals with mild to moderate learning disabilities.

Preferred Qualifications

Experience with university-level teaching and advising in a pre-service teacher education program; OTES or similar teacher evaluation, and technology skills related to special education.

Ability to oversee the undergraduate special education program of studies and work with the adjunct pool who teach those courses.
