## Transfer Guide for Cuyahoga Community College

Notre Dame welcomes Tri-C transfer students! This guide provides information to assist Cuyahoga Community College students in selecting courses for meeting applicable Core and Major requirements at Notre Dame College under NDC's 2018-2019 Catalog. Transfer credit is awarded for all college-level coursework (numbered 1000 and above) in which a grade of "D" or higher is earned. Bachelor's degree requirements include earning a minimum of 36 semester credits of upper level (300 and 400) coursework. No course can count toward two core requirements. A major cannot be earned at NDC without 50% of the major coursework completed at NDC.

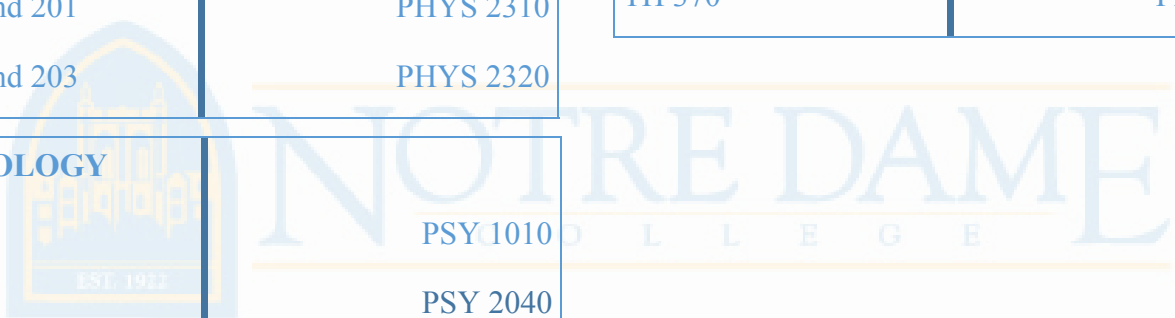
