GOOGLE TECHNOLOGY CLASSES

ED595D Google in the Digital Classroom

This is a course designed to expose teachers to trending technologies that will support and enhance classroom instruction. The course will focus on the learning management system of Google classroom with connected applications, add-ons and extensions plus a variety of interactive websites and online assessment tools. **Full tuition (\$465) is due upon registration.**

ED595O Google Fundamental Training: Google Certified Educator-Level

One

ED595P Google Advanced Training: Google Certified Educator - Level

Two

Moving beyond Google Fundamentals, this advanced course teaches cutting-edge strategies for integrating Google in the classroom. Students will be prepared to take the Level Two Google Certified Educator Exam.

Recommended Prerequisites: ED595G Using Google to Teach and Learn or ED595D Google in the Digital Classroom and ED595O Google Fundamental Training: Google Certified Educator Level One. Full tuition (\$465) is due upon registration. *Instructor: Laura Sandy*

ED595C Diverse Technology Applications for Diverse Learners

Unleash your educator "super powers: while using diverse applications of tech-based, novel computer and cell phone downloadable "apps". Using these "tech" applications along with culturally responsive instruction, provides opportunities to review and support the use of seven downloadable "apps" for simulations, gamification, collaborative project-based learning and student social-emotional support. Lessons become active and engaging, while achieving grade level or content area objectives. Student diversity is an asset and students' "cultural capital" can embellish instruction. Teachers have the opportunities for real-time formative assessment through the use of quantitative and qualitative feedback from these "apps".

ED594D Differentiating Instruction K-12

Responding to the needs of students with various readiness levels, strengths and needs can be overwhelming! In this course, participants will explore practical strategies to differentiate instruction including Project Based Learning. *Instructor: Catherine Zink*

ED594P Project Based Learning for Teachers

This online course (plus one session/presentation) enables participants to conduct a professional development project of interest while becoming proficient in the design of project based learning. Participants will self-select a project (either student based-i.e., unit on Civil War or teacher based project i.e., designing Chromebook assessments for grade 4 reading units) to complete. (Book for course: John Larmer, **Setting the Standard for Project Based Learning** is required.) **Full tuition (\$465) is due upon registration.**

ED594S Creating a Trauma Sensitive Environment K-12

This course is designed to help teachers create trauma sensitive classrooms that address the needs of traumatized children. Participants will explore different forms of trauma and their effect on the developing mind. Participants will learn strategies for creating learning environments where students have the best possible opportunity for success. **Full tuition (\$465) is due upon registration.**

ED594T Teaching Students from Poverty K-12

ED595L Century Literacy: Teaching in the Information Age

ED595T Teaching and Learning During Critical Life Changes

MINDSET, BRAIN AND EDUCATION CLASSES

ED594C Student Mindset and Classroom Management

Effective classroom management and instruction requires teachers to master many elements. Some of the topics the course will cover include: mindset & motivation, "learning to learn" skills, classroom procedures and routines, Ohio school law, parent involvement and curriculum alignment. **Full tuition (\$465) is due upon registration.**

ED594I Collaborative Coaching for Improving Instruction

Successful coaching and mentoring depend on developing a positive working relationship between mentor and mentee. Candidates will learn how to create a positive climate that enhances professional development through collaboration. The effective delivery of feedback will be explored as essential consultation skills are developed. Participants will reflect on their own interpersonal skills throughout the course. Problem identification and problem solving methods will be studied

ED594E Ethics and Principles of Teacher Leadership

This course will focus on the variables associated with developing a professional educator who can bring a full toolbox of resources to the workplace to help all students reach their full potential. Through discussion, case studies and analysis of theory and practice, participants will become better equipped to address school-based problems and issues. This course meets the requirement for the Ohio Teacher Leader Endorsement.

ED594M Measurement Based Decision Making in the Professional Learning Community

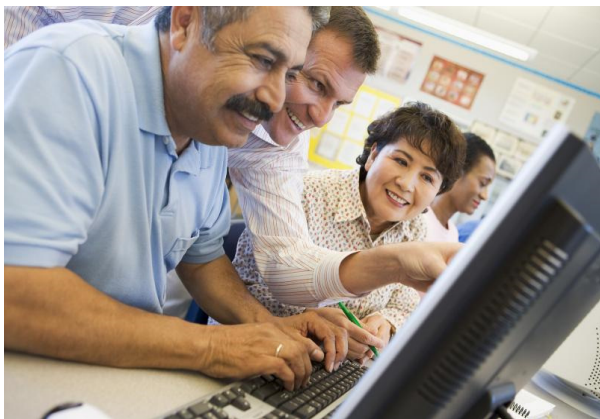
ED587A Become a Google Ninja
