Notre Dame College offers the following programs in Education which lead to specific professional licensure:

- Bachelor of Arts in Education, Early Childhood Education (Pre-K-Grade 5)
- Bachelor of Arts in Education, Mild/Moderate Intervention Specialist (K-12)
- Post-Baccalaureate Teaching License Certificate Adolescent/Young Adult Education (Grades 7-12)
- Post-Baccalaureate Teaching License Certificate Early Childhood Education (Pre-K - Grade 3)
- Post-Baccalaureate Teaching License Certificate Middle Childhood Education (Grades 4-9)
- Post-Baccalaureate Teaching License Certificate Mild/Moderate Intervention Specialist (Pre-K - Grade 12)
- Master of Education with Concentration in Mild/Moderate Intervention Specialist Licensure
- Master of Education with Educational Leadership Concentration

Each of these educational licensure programs is currently designed to meet educational requirements which lead to professional licensure in Ohio. Eligibility for educational licensure varies by state. Other out-of-state candidates should be advised they need to confirm this program meets educational requirements for licensure in the state where the student resides.
