The Department of Public Service and Security Studies at Notre Dame College is seeking applicants for a full-time (9 month) Assistant Professor faculty position in cybersecurity/and Title III cybersecurity curriculum specialist.

Responsibilities of this position would include

- Teaching a minimum of 12 credit hours per year in cybersecurity, primarily face-to-face, on-ground modality.
- Oversee development of CS curriculum, incorporating best practices and current standards
- within the applicant's area of expertise and in support of the Title III Strengthening Institutions Grant.
- Academic advising of students who major in cybersecurity and related disciplines.
- Participating in service to the college, professional development, and other scholarly activities.

While Notre Dame College is primarily a teaching institution, faculty are also encouraged to participate in research and/or other scholarly activities, with a goal of providing mentoring to undergraduate students through these activities.

Required Qualifications

- Doctoral degree in cybersecurity or related field. Candidates with a master's degree will be considered if they have significant teaching experience as well as at least 18 credit hours of graduate coursework in cybersecurity or related.
- Demonstrated higher education teaching experience, with both face-to-face and online modalities.
- Knowledge of collaborative instructional techniques and industry standard tools.
- Experience working with underrepresented students is preferred.

About the Title III Strengthening Institutions Grant

In 2019, Notre Dame College was awarded a Title III Grant by the U.S. Department of Education to establish a cutting-edge, accessible, and well-resourced Center for Intelligence and Security that develops new bachelor's degrees in Cybersecurity and in Emergency Management Policy while revitalizing the existing Intelligence Studies program. Additionally, this grant seeks to develop program-specific career pathways resources to prepare students for professions in these fields.
